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## COVID-19 Protocols

Welcome to Wright State University's Summer Enrichment Program. This year's program will follow COVID-19 approved protocols. To do so, we require assistance from parents.

### Health Assessment

Parents/guardians will receive and be required to agree and acknowledge that they will follow daily health monitoring practices for their child(ren). Daily monitoring practices will include checking body temperature and other COVID-19 symptoms. Parents will agree to follow health department guidelines. Parents/guardians will report any possible exposure of their child(ren) to COVID-19. Staff will be required to conduct daily health checks (checking temperatures and assessing symptoms) prior to arriving at Wright State University. If a child should become ill during the program, parents are expected to pick up child immediately.

### Instructional Supplies

Students will bring their own high-touch classroom materials from home. Those include scissors, pencils, pens, crayons, markers, glue, and glue sticks. Materials provided by Pre College will be handed out each day and nothing is to be shared.

### Face Coverings

Students, staff, and instructors will wear masks indoors. Masks must cover the mouth and nose and remain on unless actively eating or drinking. It is encouraged that students bring an extra mask.

### Social Distancing

Students, staff, and instructors will maintain social distancing at the CDC recommended 6 ft. distance whenever possible.

### Classrooms

Classrooms being used all have a COVID capacity of 15 or more. All classrooms will be wiped down with a CDC-approved disinfectant. Students will have an assigned seat each week. Reminders to social distance and keep your masks on will be placed in each classroom for the summer. Hand sanitizer will be placed in each room.

## **Discovery Morning Recreation Break**

Students will be instructed to be seated while eating. All recreation equipment will be sanitized.

## **Lunch Break**

Students will bring their own lunches. Students must be seated while eating. Recreation equipment will be sanitized.

## **Water Fountains**

Water fountains have been disabled. Please send a large, filled water bottle (one that your child can carry) with your child each day. Please include additional drinks for their lunch and snack. We will be outdoors as much as possible this summer.

## **Participant Illness**

In the event that a participant becomes ill while on campus, the parent/guardian will be contacted. Students will be isolated in 124 Allyn Hall. Parents will be expected to pick up their child immediately.

## **Contact Tracing**

If we are notified of any student contracting COVID-19, and your student has been identified as being in their class, or near them for an extended period of time you will be notified by email and by phone. Should this happen, CDC guidelines for quarantine will be enforced.
